

Fish and Ski Bow Rider Boats - Very Popular and Versatile

The eighteen and nineteen feet fish and ski bow rider boats have been the most sought after family boats in the boating industry over the last twenty years. The Bayliner 194 Fish and Ski is no exception.

I took a close look at the redesigned 194 during a recent boat show. This is a versatile boat, whether you are enjoying a day of skiing, pulling a tube or trying to catch that big large mouth bass on the lake everyone is talking about.

The Bayliner 194 comes standard with some really creative features.....Trolling motor, fishing rod casting decks and a unique livewell that also acts as a fish cutting board.

You will find the livewell located under the stern bench seat at back of boat. Another feature is a top notch marine sound system which comes with an mp3 jack and cd player which you will find inside the glove box.

The trolling motor located on the port side of bow is wireless with a remote enabling you to control directions while you are anywhere in the boat. I think this would be a great advantage for fisherman.

The cockpit interior consists of two very comfortable bucket seats, a stern bench seat and a really cool feature; a fisherman's casting seat hidden under the stern sun pad that is easily accessible.

The bow interior consists of two bow cushions and another fisherman's casting seat on a adjusting pedestal.

194 Ski and Fish is powered with a Mercury Marine Mercruiser 4.3L. The
boats overall length is 19 feet with a beam width of 7 ft. 11 inches.
And can seat up to nine people comfortably.
